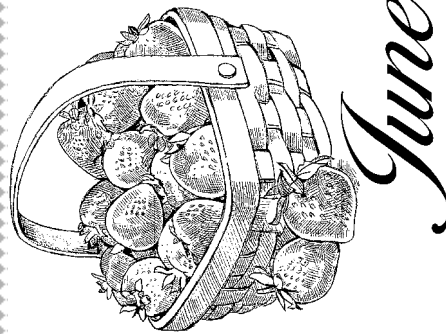
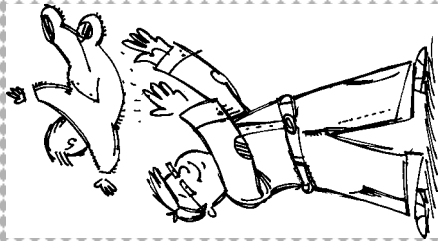

It is always an adventure spending time at the Terwilliger farm in Fisher (Clarion County), PA, as Nathan and I did Sunday night into Memorial Day. It is a journey back in time, extending as far back as 1870 when Solomon Terwilliger, from New Paltz, NY, purchased the land on which the farmhouse and barn were constructed. Staying in that farmhouse brings back fond memories of when my grandparents farmed the land. Somehow, this place helps me to feel connected with ancestors who I have never met.

Rummaging through the old treasures in the house, I came to understand that in and around this small farming village there was a felt need to relate to people in the community. In the kitchen the old crank phone is still mounted on the wall, a reminder of the "party line" in which people knew what was going on in each others' lives. This is how people knew about funerals, weddings, what was going on at the Presbyterian Church (the hub of activity in that town), whose family member was sick or who needed assistance. In one of the closets is the two-way radio that, no doubt, replaced the "party line". Grandma loved being a "CBer". Officially she was KJI-2117, but her handle was "Green Thumb". This broadened her world a little beyond Fisher, PA. She developed a friendship with Julie and Les Grim (KID=6588), in neighboring Sigel. As grandpa got older, the Grim boys helped him to put in hay each summer. They were often among the folks around the table at night playing cards and eating pie. If anyone happened to be lost in the vicinity of the farm, and stopped to ask directions, almost invariably they would end up at the dinner table with us—a quick way to turn strangers into friends.

Thinking of the sense of "community" that was fostered at the farmhouse, I hear echoes of God speaking while creating—"It is not good for the man to be alone". We were created to be in relationship with God and with each other. In fact, God alone is a relational being. This is always a bit clearer to us on Trinity Sunday, which this year is June 7. Have you ever wondered about God saying, "Let us make humankind in our image"? While we cannot say definitively that "us" means Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, it is clear that God is a relational Being. Not surprising, when asked which is the greatest commandment Jesus cited two: love God and love your neighbor as yourself. May Trinity Sunday be an opportunity for each of us to examine our relationship with God, with our family and with the communities where God placed us.

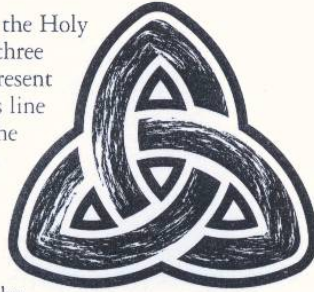

+ Christian Symbols +

Triquetra

This early symbol for the Holy Trinity is formed from three equal arcs. The arcs represent equality, the continuous line expresses eternity and the interweaving represents indivisibility. At the center is a triangle, another symbol of the Trinity. Because of its beauty and simplicity, the triquetra is often used as a design element in church architecture.



FOCUSING ON THE TRINITY

Christians are monotheists, meaning we believe in only one God. Yet we talk about the doctrine of the Trinity. In the church year, the Sunday after Pentecost is known as Trinity Sunday. It's a day for focusing on what theologians call the Triune God --- the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Someone said about the concept of the Trinity, "You will lose your soul if you don't believe it, and you will lose your mind if you try to explain it."

The bottom line is this: God (one Person) has been revealed to mankind in three ways. He is our Creator, who then came to Earth as our Savior (in the person of Jesus) and is eternally present with us as the Holy Spirit.

On Trinity Sunday, we praise our Triune God for meeting all our needs.

***WHAT IS A CHRISTIAN FAMILY?**

A CHRISTIAN FAMILY is one in which parents so live the Christian life, and practice the presence of God that children come to accept God as the greatest reality of life.


A CHRISTIAN FAMILY is one in which each member is accepted and respected as a person having sacred worth.

A CHRISTIAN FAMILY is one that accepts the responsibility of worship and instruction to the end of developing the spiritual life of each person.

A CHRISTIAN FAMILY is one that manifests a faith in God, observes daily prayer and grace at meals.

A CHRISTIAN FAMILY is one that is committed to behavior in keeping with Christian ideals for family relations, community life, and national and world citizenship.

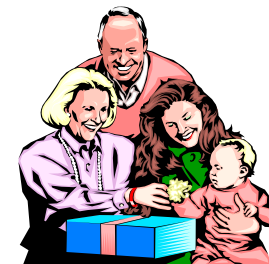

- Write appreciation messages on self-stick notes and, with your mom's help, place them all over the inside of your dad's car.

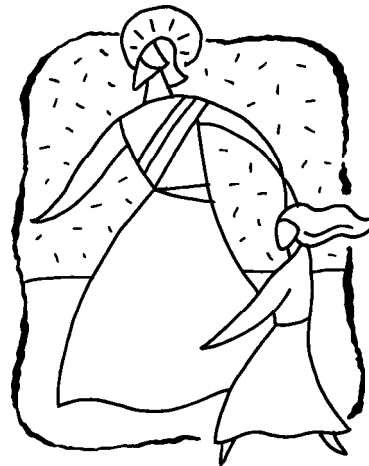


*All these ideas will work also for Mom on Mother's Day or her birthday.

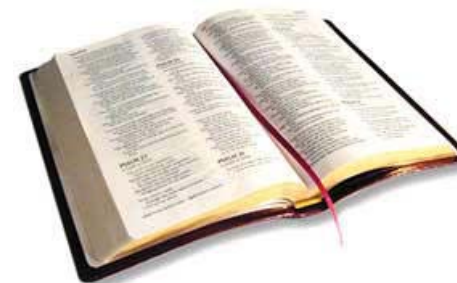

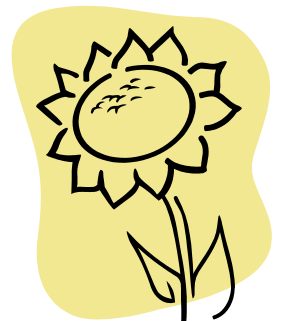

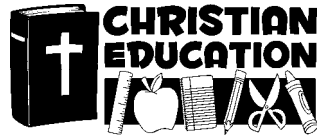
